The project is building on the Community Based DRR actives that the VRCS has been doing in rural areas. The project will run simultaneously in two cities in Indonesia, so cross cultural learning between disaster prone countries will occur through Asia Pacific.

The project addresses community and city resilience against climate change, which is directly linked to Vanuatu's strategic goal of <u>resilient development</u>.
